



## Tips for Best Results













- Print on heavy cardstock or photo paper for best durability.
- Ensure printer settings are set to "Actual Size" or "100% Scale" to avoid distortion.
- Use sharp scissors or a craft knife with a ruler for precise cutting.
- Score fold lines lightly before folding for clean, crisp edges.
- Allow printed pages to dry completely before handling to prevent smudging.
- Test a single page first to confirm settings and appearance.
- For double-sided printing, refer to your printer's manual for correct alignment.
- Templates can be scaled, but clarity may vary; always check before final printing.
- Recommended paper weight: 80-110 lb (216-300 gsm) cardstock for sturdy projects.
- Keep templates clean and dry to maintain quality for future use.




## Common Issues & Solutions

- Blurry Text or Images: Check printer resolution and ink levels.
- Misaligned Prints: Re-calibrate printer alignment or check paper feed.
- Colors Look Off: Adjust color settings in printer preferences.
- Paper Jams: Ensure paper is loaded correctly and is not too thick for your printer.


